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2006 RESOLUTION

Whereas:

The cost of transportation imposes a considerable and debilitating burden on the communities of the Kivalliq and Northern Manitoba

And whereas:

The governments of Nunavut and Manitoba in conjunction with the Kivalliq Inuit Association have been engaged in a scoping study on a Nunavut to Manitoba road to alleviate the burden imposed by high transportation costs as well as to open the region to more positive development

Be it resolved that:

The parties to the scoping study, namely the Government of Nunavut, the Government of Manitoba and the Kivalliq Inuit Association with their sponsor, the Government of Canada, be encouraged to continue and accelerate where possible the process of addressing Kivalliq and Northern Manitoba's inordinate transportation burden through the construction of an all-weather road link from Rankin Inlet to the road transportation grid in Northern Manitoba.

The annual harvest of caribou on Southampton Island adds approximately \$4,500,000 in direct and indirect economic spin-offs to the non-decentralized community of Coral Harbour;

Whereas upwards of forty-five people find part-time employment in the nondecentralized community of Coral Harbour in prosecuting the harvest;

And whereas:

Upwards of fifteen people find full time employment in the community of Rankin Inlet in processing the product of the harvest;

And whereas

The activity is sustainable and in fact needed to curb population growth so the herd does not crash from over extending the environments capacity to support it;

Significant additional value-added activities from the harvest are possible and have yet to be explored;

Funding support from the Government of Nunavut is necessary for the harvest to continue and this funding support requires continuing and time-consuming re-application on an annual basis,
