## Overview of the Sixth Nunavut General Election

The Chief Electoral Officer issued writs of election to 22 Returning Officers on September 20, 2021. At the end of the declaration of candidacy period there were 58 candidates running in 17 constituencies. One candidate from Gjoa Haven withdrew and 5 constituencies had their candidates acclaimed.

Early voting opportunities were promoted to mitigate pandemic-related concerns. The Chief Electoral Officer used his authority under the *Nunavut Elections Act* to expand mobile voting and emergency voting to ensure voters who were in isolation or had contracted covid were able to vote safely.

48% of registered Nunavut voters cast their vote for their choice of Member of the Legislative Assembly in their constituency.

The Returning Officers for Cambridge Bay and Amittuq applied to the Nunavut Court of Justice for a judicial recount, as the vote difference was between 2% of the winning and second place candidate. Recounts took place in Sanirajak and Cambridge Bay, with the Judge finding those election results were unchanged.





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## Introduction of the Office of the Chief Electoral Officer

The Office of the Chief Electoral Officer (Elections Nunavut) is an independent office of the Legislative Assembly of Nunavut that is overseen by the Chief Electoral Officer. Elections Nunavut is responsible for the administration of territorial and municipal elections and by-elections under the *Nunavut Elections Act*, as well as plebiscites under the *Plebiscites Act*. Under a separate agreement, Elections Nunavut also administers local option liquor plebiscites under the *Liquor Act* for the Department of Finance.

As an independent officer, the Chief Electoral Officer is accountable directly to the Legislative Assembly through the Speaker. This ensures the Office of the Chief Electoral Officer can administer elections and plebiscites in a non-partisan manner; maintaining the integrity of the entire democratic process for all Nunavummiut. The Chief Electoral Officer is appointed by the Commissioner of Nunavut for a 7-year term.

The Management and Services Board provides oversight of the budgetary and human resource requirements of Elections Nunavut. The Chief Electoral Officer is required to report annually to the Legislative Assembly, as well as to report on specific election/plebiscite events. These reports include recommendations that the Chief Electoral Officer believes will assist in improving the *Nunavut Elections Act* and the

election/plebiscite process. Elections Nunavut provides GIS and mapping support to the Boundaries Commission. The Boundaries Commission is responsible to hold public hearings and propose boundaries and names of constituencies to the Legislative Assembly. The next electoral Boundaries Commission will commence in 2022.

Elections Nunavut works with many public and private partners to ensure elections and plebiscites are run as effectively and efficiently as possible. Legal counsel, information technology (IT) support, geographic information system (GIS) upkeep, audit oversight, and electronic voter database management (EVDM) support are all secured through external professional contracts.

The office is located in Rankin Inlet and consists of four permanent employees. The year before and after an event, the casual employees and contract election officers increase the office size to over 200 people.



## Summary of Legislative Amendments Impacting the 2021 General Election

Recent amendments to the *Nunavut Elections Act* have created some changes for candidates and voters in the 2021 General Election.

### **Local Time to be Used for Election Day**

The polls will now be open on Election Day from 9am to 7pm local time in every constituency.

### **Introduction of a Future Voters List**

16- and 17-year-old youth can now register to vote (but they will still have to wait until they turn 18 to vote).

### **Rules for Members of Municipal Council Who Want to Run**

Mayors or councillors who wish to become a candidate in an MLA election must take leave from their position on council.

### **Expand Emergency Voting**

The use of emergency voting (telephone voting) has been expanded to allow for those who are unable to vote on Election Day because of an unexpected absence.

### **Elimination of Proxy Voting**

By expanding emergency voting, anyone who may have voted by proxy can now vote by emergency voting. Proxy voting is no longer available.

### **Deadline for Special (mail-in) ballot applications**

To ensure ballots can be processed, delivered, and returned on time, the deadline for applying for a mail-in ballot is 7 days before election day.

### **Exception for Audit Requirement**

Audits will not be required if the candidate received less than \$500 in contributions and spent less than \$500 on their campaign.

### **Limit on total amount of Anonymous Contributions**

A Financial Agent cannot accept more than \$2,500 in total anonymous contributions.

### **Clarify When an Account needs to be Opened by the Financial Agent**

A financial agent must open an account before receiving contributions, and no later than 21 days before election.

## Nunavut Youth *Motivate to Vote* Initiative

In partnership with the Representative for Children and Youth Ilitaqsiniq developed and administered a youth *Motivate to Vote* project. The project coincided with the General Election, with objectives to:

1. Increase democratic literacy through peer engagement;
2. Motivate youth to register and vote in the general election;
3. Promote the provisional voters list- future voter initiative;
4. Address systemic misconceptions about voter registration and voting; and
5. Build leadership abilities for the participants.

The project involved 5 social media influencers using their online reach to engage their peers during the election periods.

## Nunavut Student Vote



### The Department of Education

In partnership with the Department of Education, CIVIX hosted a student vote in almost half of all Nunavut schools. The vote occurred in conjunction with the 2021 General Election, with 654 students voting in 10 constituencies.



## Provincial/Territorial Election Management Bodies



**Elections Saskatchewan** generously donated 150 voting barriers, 12,000 single use pencils and 14,000 masks to Elections Nunavut.



**Elections Canada** provided Elections Nunavut with voting barriers that were leftover from the Federal Election.



**Elections NWT** provided support in developing the youth *Motivate to Vote* project.

## Enforcement Protocol

The enforcement protocol is based on a memorandum of understanding of the roles and responsibilities of each party under the *Nunavut Elections Act*. The protocol outlines the steps to take regarding investigations and any enforcement actions based on contraventions of the Act. The Integrity commissioner has the overall authority to determine the action to take in response to an alleged contravention of the Act, including a compliance agreement.

## Information Sharing

### Vital Statistics

The Department of Health, Vital Statistics division provides Elections Nunavut with information on residents of Nunavut who have either left the Territory permanently or are deceased. This information sharing is guided by a MOU and is authorized under Section 42(3)(e) of the *Nunavut Elections Act*. Elections Nunavut uses this information to update the voters lists

### Office of the Chief Medical Officer

The Office of the Chief Medical Officer provided guidance and support in contingency planning for pandemic related interruptions. Election Officers were granted essential services status to ensure the uninterrupted delivery of the election.



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## Outreach, Resources and Logisitics

## **Human and Venue Resources**

**Returning Officers:** The Chief Electoral Officer appointed 22 Returning Officers (ROs) for the 22 constituencies in Nunavut. The term of their appointments ends one year after the General Election. Four, 3-day training courses were held during August and September.

**Assistant Returning Officers:** Returning Officers appointed 39 Assistant Returning Officers (AROs). The term of their appointments ceased the day following the election. AROs participated with the ROs during the 3-day training sessions during August and September.

**Deputy Returning Officers & Poll Clerks:** Returning Officers appointed 36 Deputy Returning Officers (DROs) and 36 Poll Clerks (PCs) shortly after the writs were issued. The term of their appointments ceased the day following the election. The DROs and PCs attended 1-day training sessions presented by the ROs and AROs in each constituency.

**Registration Clerks:** Returning Officers appointed 35 Registration Clerks (RCs). The term of their appointments ceased the day following the election. The RCs participated in the 1-day training session with the DROs and PCs.

**Other Election Officers:** 34 Sanitization Clerks were employed to ensure voting areas were frequently disinfected and to ensure physical distancing and venue capacity limits were being followed.

One Deputy Returning Officer- Special Ballot Coordinator and one Poll Clerk-Special Ballot Coordinator (both positioned in Rankin Inlet) were appointed. The term of their appointments ceased the day following the election.

## **Office and Voting Locations**

During the election periods, the office of the Returning Officer is a location for the public to obtain information on the electoral process, register to vote or make changes to their registration, and vote in advance voting opportunities.

The office is also where prospective candidates, financial agents and campaign managers can obtain information on participating in the election and submitting the candidate's declaration of candidacy.

An office was secured for every constituency. For the most part, these offices have been consistently used in previous events to establish location memory. In communities with more than one constituency, the returning officers shared the location to centralize the electoral activities.

During the advance vote in certain communities and on Election Day, larger voting venues were secured to accommodate the increased numbers of voters who typically vote on these days. Due to COVID-19 capacity restrictions, Iqaluit's four constituencies each had their own voting location on Election Day.

## Technology

### At the Polls- *VoterView*

Field and headquarters staff were now able to share information in real-time during the election. *Voterview* is an electronic voter data management system that replaced paper copies of polling records and allowed poll staff to add, search and strike off voters electronically. This new technology permitted voters to vote at any open polling station that was open. It also allowed remote poll stations to be conducted simultaneously with central poll stations.

### Online Candidate Portal

Candidates were provided with access to a portal to download the voters list for their constituency and extract information about which voters had voted. This replaced the in-person paper copies previously provided during an election period. It also provided the opportunity for candidates to observe voting progress remotely and to reduce human interaction during voting.

### Online Voter Registration

In addition to registering in-person, voters now have the opportunity to register or update their voter registration online via the website of Elections Nunavut.


### Online Application for Special Ballot

Voters are now able to apply for a special ballot electronically through the website of Elections Nunavut.

## Outreach

### Social Media

Elections Nunavut revamped their website to incorporate all the new technological advancements. Facebook, Twitter and Instagram were utilized to share Nunavut-wide and community specific information on the election. New icons and a poster series were developed to recognize the influence the pandemic had on the administration of the election.

## Mitigation Planning

The COVID-19 pandemic had a significant impact on how Elections Nunavut administered the 2021 General Election.


The office worked closely with the office of the Chief Public health Officer to ensure all communities had an opportunity to participate in forming our government while remaining safe.

### What Elections Nunavut did to keep Voters, Candidates and Election workers safe

- Online voter registration was made available to reduce voter/election officer interaction.
- Candidates were provided with an online portal to observe voter sequencing remotely.
- Returning Officers offered mobile polls to Nunavut's most vulnerable populations.
- Voters were required to wear masks during voting in-person. Masks were offered to those who did not bring their own.
- Voters were provided with single-use pencils.
- Sanitization stations were set up every polling location.
- Election Officers sanitized the voting booths regularly.
- Election Officers ensured everyone practiced physical distancing.
- Protective barriers were in place to separate voters from election officers.

**Candidates** were advised that changes to the voting process in response to the pandemic could delay certain aspects of the election, and voting, counting, and results-reporting deadlines could be lengthened.

**Voters** were encouraged to vote during advance voting opportunities and to vote by remote means if they were unwell or in isolation.



## **Our Pandemic Guiding Considerations:**

- 1. Inuuqatigiitsiarniq:** The safety of voters, candidates, election officers and the communities are paramount.
- 2. Aajiiqatigiinniq:** The Office of the Chief Electoral Officer will require cooperation with the office of the Chief Public Health Officer during the election periods. Decisions on any course of action to take will involve discussion and consensus.
- 3. Ikajuqtigiinniq:** The Office of the Chief Electoral Officer will ensure activities during an election abide by the orders issued by the Chief Public Health Officer to ensure our communities remain safe.
- 4. Pijitsirniq:** Each community within a constituency will be assessed separately for the risk to the community, voters, candidates and election officers, and targeted measures will be undertaken in a manner consistent with contingency planning.
- 5. Qanuqtuurniq:** The Office of the Chief Electoral Officer will adapt to address challenges as they arise, whilst preserving the integrity of the election and maintaining the confidence of Nunavummiut.
- 6. Tunnganarniq:** It is vital to have clear, concise, and consistent dialogue with the communities, candidates, and voters.



## Alternative Methods for Voting

In addition to the traditional method for voting in-person at a polling location, Elections Nunavut offered alternative voting choices for all Nunavut voters.



### Special Ballot- Mail-in

This method accommodated voters who were away from their home community during the election period. A ballot was sent to the voter at their destination and had to be returned prior to the close of polls on Election Day.

Due to the pandemic, the Chief Electoral Officer also permitted voters who were in isolation, ill or were not comfortable attending a polling location in-person to vote by this method as well.




### Special Ballot- Emergency

Voters who were unable to vote on Election Day because of an unexpected absence or who were in a remote place and unable to vote, were permitted to vote by telephone.




### Mobile Poll

Election Officers brought the poll to the residences of those who were unable to attend a polling location in-person due to mobility or other challenges.



### Voting in the Office of the Returning Office (VORO)

In communities that hosted a Returning Officer, in-person voting was permitted for VORO over 10 days leading up to Election Day.



### Advance Vote

In communities that only hosted an Assistant Returning Officer, in person voting was permitted for one day prior to Election Day.

## **Voter Data Management System**

Elections Nunavut maintains the voters list in an electronic database Voterview hosted by DataFix. Voterview permits election officers to register new voters, change voter information, and strike off voters during elections and plebiscites. During an election, candidates are provided with access to a portal which allows them to retrieve specific information on voters in their constituency including name, address and if they have voted. If a candidate does not have access to the portal, an encrypted electronic copy is provided. After the election, the candidate is required to destroy the list or return it to Elections Nunavut.

## **Voter Information Card**

Voter Information Cards (VIC) are mailed to each registered voter during the election period. The VIC contains the voters name and address and provides information on where and when voting in their constituency takes place. If the information is incorrect, the voter can contact an election officer to make amendments. If the voter no longer resides at the postal address, the post office returns the VIC to Elections Nunavut for further investigation.





## Early Voting Results

Elections Nunavut encouraged voters to utilize early voting opportunities while there were no active COVID-19 cases in their communities. Early voting accounted for 25% of all votes cast in the election (an increase of 10% over the 2017 General Election).

Early voting includes voting in the office of the Returning officer, voting on advance vote day, voting through mobile polling and voting by special ballots (mail-in).






## Voter Turnout

## Appendix A: Adaptations of the *Nunavut Elections Act*

During the election period, the Chief Electoral Officer adapted certain provisions of the *Nunavut Elections Act* to accommodate unusual or unforeseen circumstances.

### **Expansion of eligibility for Special Ballot Sections 99 and Mobile Poll Section 121 NEA**

The Chief Electoral Officer issued direction that the voters who were ill, in isolation, or preferred not to attend a polling station would be eligible to vote by a mail-in ballot or through a mobile poll. This direction was necessary to mitigate the real and perceived barriers placed by COVID-19 pandemic on voters.

### **Extend Advance Voting Day in Coral Harbour Section 94 NEA**

The Chief Electoral officer issued direction to the Returning Officer for the constituency of Aivilik to extend the advance voting day for one extra day. This direction was necessary to mitigate the real and perceived barriers placed by COVID-19 pandemic on voters in Coral Harbour during a community lockdown.

### **Extend the Period to Send the Financial Return Section 180 NEA**

The Chief Electoral Officer issued a direction to extend the period to send the financial return. This direction was necessary to mitigate challenges placed on candidates due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

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*The Nunavut Elections Act gives the Chief Electoral Officer the authority to adapt or change almost any aspect of an election if there is an emergency.*

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*The only aspect of an election that cannot be adapted or changed is the deadline to accept declarations of candidacy.*

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## Appendix B: Summary of Complaints, Investigations and Prosecutions

### Complaint #1

A *candidate* in the constituency of Pond Inlet submitted a complaint to the RCMP that another candidate had performed a funeral service during the election period.

Result: The RCMP investigation determined charges under the *Nunavut Elections Act* were not warranted.

### Complaint #2

A *voter* in the constituency of Pond Inlet submitted a complaint to the RCMP that a candidate had performed a funeral service during the election period.

Result: The RCMP investigation determined charges under the *Nunavut Elections Act* were not warranted.

### Complaint #3

The Chief Electoral Officer submitted a complaint to the RCMP identifying two candidates and their financial agents who failed to complete and submit the financial return by the end of the post-election period. Due to complications arising from COVID-19 and postal disruptions, the Chief Electoral Officer extended the deadline by 5 weeks.

Elections Nunavut attempted to contact all candidates and their financial agents by email and phone prior to the original and extended deadlines to offer assistance and encourage compliance.

Result: The investigations are ongoing.
