Since the time of the survey, the Granular Crushing Equipment Policy and Program was implemented. In 2024-25 three communities were approved for the program; Baker Lake, Kinngait, and Pond Inlet. The callout for applications for the 2025-26 year was issued in October 2024 and five submissions were received. Three to acquire granular material and two for the procurement of granular equipment. These five applications are currently being review, scored and ranked. The department will be responding to the applicants in the coming month to communicate approved applications and coordinate procurement planning.

Hamlet Permit Orders

On November 5, 2024, MLA Malliki expressed his appreciation for our assistance given to the Hamlet of Coral Harbour with their arena’s code challenges. His line of questioning included a request for information on other community arenas that were not in code with the electrical and building codes and as the discussion continued, the requested expanded to include other community facilities where public events happen.

There currently are no municipal facilities that are under a safety order for code issues related to electrical or building codes from my department.

Both the Office of the Chief Building Official and the Office of the Chief Electrical Inspector have the authority to conduct inspections under the Building Code Act and the Electrical Protection Act respectively. These inspections most commonly occur during new construction or during renovations to existing structures. It is the obligation of building owners in Nunavut or their representative to follow all the requirements of the respective Acts, Regulations and referenced Codes and Standards. This includes applying for the permits. Once the permit application process has begun both the Office of the Chief Building Official and the Office of the Chief Electrical Inspector ensure that work being completed meets the building and electrical codes.
