Speaker (Mr. David Joanasie) (interpretation): Good afternoon, my fellow colleagues. Before we proceed, Mr. Kaernerk, please start with prayer.

Item 2: Election of Speaker

Clerk (Mr. Stephen Innuksuk) (interpretation): Thank you. It is the clerk's duty to inform you that Her Honour the Commissioner of Nunavut will not enter the House until you have chosen the speaker. Is there a motion to appoint the speaker? Ms. Brewster.

Motion 1 - 7(1): Appointment of Speaker

Ms. Brewster: Thank you, Mr. Clerk.

I move, seconded by the Member for Baker Lake, that David Joanasie, Member for South Baffin, do take the chair of this House as Speaker. Thank you, Mr. Clerk.

Clerk (interpretation): The motion is in order. To the motion. All those in favour? Against? The motion is carried. I ask will the mover and the seconder to please escort Mr. Joanasie to the chair.

Speaker (interpretation): Can you hear me? I asked the Sergeant-at-Arms to raise the Mace.

As speaker of the Legislative Assembly of Nunavut, I am honoured to welcome our guests to the House and also everyone in Nunavut who are watching or listening, please be welcome to the first sitting of the 7th Assembly.

I would like to thank all members for the trust and confidence you have placed in me by selecting me to serve as your speaker.

As your speaker, I am committed to upholding the rights and privileges of this institution and its members.

All members can be confident that I will fulfill the responsibilities of the speakership in a manner that is consistent with the office's obligation to demonstrate fairness and impartiality.

Earlier today, all members of this House took their oaths of allegiance and office.

I take this opportunity to thank constituents in South Baffin for their support in the recent election, which ran very well. I can assure all residents of Kimmirut and Kinngait that even though I'm the speaker, I will be advocating for the constituency through the appropriate channels in the appropriate manner.

I wish to take this opportunity to mourn the recent passing of Rebecca Becky Mike, who represented a Nunavut constituency in the territorial legislature prior to division; a member of the Legislative Assembly.

I also take the opportunity to mourn the recent passing of a well-known interpreter, Attima Hadlari, who was a well-known leader in the Kitikmeot and a long-serving interpreter-translator for this institution. We have them and their families in our thoughts, and all their friends.

We will now proceed with the Orders of the Day. At this time I will ask the Clerk to determine if Her Honour the Commissioner of Nunavut is prepared to enter the chamber to deliver the Opening Address. All rise.

Opening Address of the Commissioner of Nunavut

Commissioner Eva Qamaniq Aariak (interpretation): Please be seated.

Mr. Speaker, Premier, Members of the Legislative Assembly, honoured guests and Nunavummiut who are watching these proceedings on TV or online, good afternoon.

Now four years ago this week I delivered the opening address to mark the convening of the 6th Legislative Assembly. At that time the public health state of emergency required that the Visitors' Gallery had to be closed. However, this afternoon it is good to see so many people joining us this afternoon. Please feel welcome.

Earlier today I had the absolute honour of presiding over the swearing-in ceremony for members of the 7th Assembly of Nunavut. I know from personal experience, having gone through it, the feelings that many of you are having today.

A number of you are serving in your second, third or fourth terms of office, and I thank you for your continued commitment to Nunavut and Nunavummiut, because you want to serve them. A number of you are newly elected members, and I thank you for assuming the challenges and responsibilities that accompany public office. You will have to handle many heavy things during your terms in office.

Earlier this week you selected the premier and members of the Executive Council. Formal motions to confirm these selections will be made during today's sitting, and I look forward to signing the official instruments of appointment.

In our territory's non-partisan, consensus style of government, I know that all members of the Legislative Assembly play an important role, and I am confident that you will all make valuable contributions to the deliberations of this House during your terms of office. I know you will work very hard in your seats.

In the coming weeks and months you will focus your collective energy towards defining a mandate for your term, all the things that will be followed until the end of your terms.

Also, as you will be aware, my term of office ends early next year. I look forward to welcoming the appointment of my successor.

I wish to take this opportunity to pay tribute to recently passed members, including the late Rebekah Uqi Williams, who served as Deputy Commissioner from September of 2019 until her passing, when she was the Deputy Commissioner. I'm very grateful to her.

I would also like to thank the current Deputy Commissioner, Lew Philip, for his hard work and support to the office.

I would like to say that it has been a tremendous honour serving as Commissioner of Nunavut. I've been happy in it ever since I got appointed. Over the past half decade I have had the opportunity to spend time in many of our beautiful communities to meet many of our wonderful residents. Having the privilege to bestow awards and honoured on deserving Nunavummiut has been a highlight of my role.

I also wish to acknowledge and thank former speaker Tony Akoak -- I was glad to see you early on, and he's also in the gallery as well -- for the successful Mace Tours in which we both took part, when we would invite the public to see the Mace. Thank you.

I wish to conclude by reflecting on the pride we take in the appointment of Her Excellency Mary Simon as our country's Governor General, and we extend our warmest wishes to His Majesty the King.

I now declare open the first session of the 7th Legislative Assembly. Thank you.

Once I have recognized you, please wait for the light on your desk to come on before you rise and begin speaking. Please stand and speak your statement. Once you're done, please sit down.

I would like to recognize member for Igaluit-Tasiluk, Mr. Hickes.

Member's Statement 1 - 7(1): Reflections on being Elected to Represent Iqaluit-Tasiluk

Mr. Hickes: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Mr. Speaker, congratulations on seeking and getting the speaker's chair. As I said yesterday, it's a very honoured position in this Assembly, and I know you will do it justice.

Mr. Speaker, none of us would be in this room without our families. I would like to take a moment to really publicly thank my wife Signi and my four daughters, Hope, Jordan, Lilly and Sarah. Without their support, I would not have gone even into my first term, never mind my fourth term.

Mr. Speaker, I would also like to publicly thank my father, George Senior, and his wife Pauline. I still, some people jokingly call him my political advisor and my senior political advisor, and I can't thank him enough for all the advice and direction he's given me over my career and helped me become the member that I am today.

I also couldn't do it without my mom, Carol, and her husband Paul. Again, just the core upbringing and the values and all the teachings that they passed on to me has helped me become the man that I am today. Still not perfect, but I'm working on it every day to make my children proud of me.

Mr. Speaker, I would be remiss if I didn't take a moment to thank my constituents. With the recent boundary changes I met some new faces on the campaign trail. This year I knocked on over 500 doors. It was an exhausting and an exhilarating experience, Mr. Speaker, as I'm sure many constituents learning what direction that they want me to take in this House.

I would also like to thank my colleagues here for electing me to the Executive Council once again. I would like to think I am going to bring that experience that I have had over my previous terms to this table.

It's a very strong room. I'm incredibly proud of everyone in this room. I'm incredibly proud of my cabinet colleagues. I know we have a got a lot of work and challenges ahead of us, but I also know that we are all up to the task.

With that, I want to congratulate everyone on their appointments. I look forward working with you all for the next four years. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Member's Statement 2 - 7(1): Reflections on being Elected to Represent Cambridge Bay

Mr. Pedersen: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. To start, I would like to congratulate yourself in your new role as speaker and to Mr. Main on becoming premier of this Legislative Assembly; congratulations as well to the eight members who have been selected to cabinet.

I would also like to thank the voters of Cambridge Bay for putting their trust in me to represent their concerns in this House. I must also thank my wife and family for supporting me throughout the campaign, because without that support I would not have been able to do this.

Mr. Speaker, I did not put my name for cabinet, as the voters of Cambridge Bay wanted an MLA to sit on this side of the House to be able to ask the government representative tough and credible questions. This is what I will be doing during this 7th Assembly. I will

I will also look to ensure that our government remains transparent and accountable to all residents of Nunavut. All government departments must act in this way to ensure that any new Auditor General reports are favourable.

Their guidance and support in our youth activities brought so much joy and strength to the campaign, and I am grateful for their ongoing leadership and commitment to our young people.

I would also like to thank Adam Arreak Lightstone, who previously served as the member for Iqaluit-Manirajak for the past eight years.

Mr. Speaker, there is a lot of work ahead of us. These last ten days of orientation have shown us the depth and complexity of the work, and how much there is to learn. I have also, our colleagues have also shown me something more important, and that is a genuine willingness to among all of us to work together and listen respectfully, and move forward collectively for the benefit of Nunavummiut.

Member's Statement 6 - 7(1): Reflections on being Elected to Represent Aivilik

Ms. Angootealuk (interpretation): Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I would like to thank my Aivilik residents who voted for me, and also to the people who didn't vote for me. I treat you all the same equally. I thank you. I want to provide support to all the people of Aivilik equally.

I want to thank my family, my husband and my children, and my grandchildren. As well I want to mention now who nominated me. I want to thank him for looking and saying that I'm capable. And also as well to our elders who provide advice to me, Angaq Immertaq (ph). When there's no more elders we lose advisors. I thank him for providing advice to me. As well and my finance officer, Donna Eetuk (ph). I thank you as well for providing assistance to me and helping me and for your support. I thank all the people of Coral Harbour who believe in me. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Speaker (interpretation): Thank you. To my list, Member for Iqaluit-Niaqunnguu, Mr. Akeeagok.

Member's Statement 7 - 7(1): Reflections on being Elected to Represent Iqaluit-Niaqunnguu

Mr. Akeeagok: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Mr. Speaker, I am very proud that you are able to now sit in the speaker's chair and I'm grateful. However, we will no longer be in the cabinet together, but I know you did a lot of work in your ministerial ship. I know we will do much work in our 7th Assembly.

I would also like to acknowledge and recognize my family, my children, who always give me support and I'm very grateful. I am able now to sit on my third term with their commitment to supporting me. And I did decide at this round to run for Iqaluit-Niaqunnguu. I realize there are many houses here, and far in between, and sometimes it took me all day to visit many homes. I received a lot of welcoming meeting people, and who gave me a lot of advice here in Iqaluit. I'm grateful for those who welcomed me. And those who did not vote, hopefully next time they will be inspired to

vote. It is unfortunate we didn't have a big show in voters. Hopefully that will change in elections.

I would like to thank all my colleagues, my fellow MLAs, that we are now here sitting as we were elected. Thank you for selecting me for the cabinet, and I will be fully committed to that. I hope we will join our elders and have tea with our elders here in Iqaluit at the elders centre. Our elders and Iqaluiummiut are very with welcoming. Hopefully you will in turn show hospitality as well. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Speaker (interpretation): Thank you. Next on my list, Tununiq MLA, Mr. Koonoo.

Member's Statement 8 - 7(1): Reflections on being Elected to Represent Tununiq

Mr. Koonoo (interpretation): Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and thank you for correcting my name.

First of all I would like to thank my wife, my children, my family for their full support and commitment, and also to the voters in Pond Inlet and those who did not vote as well and I'm very grateful that I am able to sit here. I'm grateful also that I can sit as a minister as trust has been put on me. I'm very grateful.

I'm proud of you, all of you who were elected for your MLA positions, those younger and older members.

I would also like to acknowledge John Main, although he's a Qallunaat. He's the first Qallunaat becoming a premier and you are very fluent in Inuktitut, and people in Nunavut knows your full commitment.

David Joanasie, I am proud that you are able to sit in the speaker's chair.

I would like to work diligently with all of you. Whether we go through hardships or not, we should never waiver as we work together. We want Nunavut moving forward, and we want a good positive future. Member's Statement 9 - 7(1): Reflections on being Elected to Represent Rankin Inlet South

Ms. Tattuinee (interpretation): Thank you, Mr. Speaker. First of all I would like to thank those who voted for me. In my visits I thought we have very many houses in Rankin

Inlet, and I was given a lot of support from people and listened to their concerns. I am here because of them. Thank you.

I would like to acknowledge my children, Kyle, Brian and Terry, who always give me support. And I am very proud of them and they are very capable, and also give me strength to myself. And my in-law, who arrived here as well. I'm proud of her and I learned much, how great it is as Inuit and we need to showcase more of our abilities, because we have deep thoughts. In the past we didn't have paper. We used our mind, our memory and learned by observation.

And I stand with my people to be proud to that fact, and I can say as Inuit we are very capable, and as we come to this point we need to be even more capable with difficulties around the world and more focus on Nunavut on the outside. And all of us who are here, we know we will do a very good job. Thank you very much (interpretation ends) I just want to thank everybody for allowing me to be here and to sit at this table and to be a member of the Executive Council. Thank you. Thank you, Mr. Chair.

Member's Statement 10 - 7(1): Reflections on being Elected to Represent Hudson Bay

Mr. Qavvik: (interpretation) Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Good afternoon, my colleagues and Nunavummiut.

First of all, Mr. Speaker, I would like to show my appreciation that you were selected to be the speaker, and I'm also very proud of our new premier and the cabinet. I know you will work closely together for the benefit of Nunavummiut. And all you MLAs, I'm also very proud that you were able to be elected. It took work to be sitting on the 7th Nunavut Legislative Assembly, as we will take on.

Member's Statement 12 - 7(1): Reflections on being Elected to Represent Gjoa Haven

Mr. Porter (interpretation): Thank you, Mr. Speaker. (interpretation ends) Congratulations, Speaker, Premier, and cabinet. Congratulations.

I would like to extend my gratitude to Mr. Tony Akoak for his tireless effort and dedication to serving Gjoa Haven over three Assemblies.

I would like to also thank the community members of Gjoa Haven for electing me to this 7th Assembly. I would like to acknowledge Megan Porter, Greg Nahaglulik, David Akoak and Sonny Porter for putting your names forward in the election.

I want to thank my wife, my family for their support in my journey here. (interpretation) Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Speaker (interpretation): Thank you. Pangnirtung MLA, Mr. Mike. Your time.

Member's Statement 13 - 7(1): Reflections on being Elected to Represent Pangnirtung

Mr. Mike (interpretation): I would like to express my appreciation to all of you who were elected as MLAs. We are directed by our communities through elections, and we will be speaking on their behalf here. And I want to participate fully as well. First of all, I am pleased, Mr. Speaker, for your selection as speaker and our new premier, John Main, and the ministers.

And also I would like to thank my family, in particular my wife, who I also work with. She was planning to be here but she's not here yet. I was first elected as an MLA and elected as a minister and my wife was an Anglican minister then. When I became a minister, we became both ministers. I can't forget that. My wife is always my biggest supporter, and my children and my grandchildren. And they committed themselves much in this election. I would also like to thank the election in Pangnirtung.
