SUPPORT FOR THE GRAYS BAY PORT AND ROAD PROJECT

Whereas, Nunavut Resources Corporation (NRC), a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Kitikmeot Inuit Association (KIA), has identified the *Grays Bay Road & Port Project* as a transformative infrastructure project of national significance, and;

Whereas the *Grays Bay Road & Port Project* will help to define economic development in the Kitikmeot region throughout the 21st century by creating a transportation backbone that improves the quality of life in Kitikmeot communities and helps overcome barriers to regional growth, and;

Whereas, as part of NRC's efforts, the KIA entered into a Memorandum of Understanding with the Government of Nunavut on July 10th, 2016 to jointly advance the Grays Bay Road & Port Project with the intention of KIA becoming the owner of this publicly-accessible infrastructure, and;

Whereas, the KIA President and NRC's Chair provided a detailed presentation on the Grays Bay Road and Port Project to a duly constituted KIA Annual General Meeting in Cambridge Bay, Nunavut on October 6, 2016.

Therefore, it be resolved; that the KIA AGM Assembly, representing the Inuit of all five Kitikmeot communities, recognizes and favourably views the significant potential benefits that the Grays Bay Road and Port Project could provide to the Kitikmeot region and to Kitikmeot Inuit. As such, the KIA AGM Assembly affirms its support for KIA's continued involvement as a joint proponent of the project, in partnership with the Government of Nunavut. The KIA AGM Assembly directs the KIA to continue to advance the initiative at all available levels in a manner that is consistent with the KIA's mandate, values and vision. The KIA AGM Assembly specifically directs KIA to effectively engage the KIA membership, and other key stakeholders, in order to build awareness and support for this important project.

WHEREAS, THE YOUTH PRESENTED THEIR REPORT TO THE KIA ASSEMBLY WHICH INCLUDED THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. Supporting & Exploring Development of Youth Centers in All Kitikmeot Communities while creating plans for each community to move forward
- 2. Apply for Funding from the Department of Culture & Heritage Youth Centre Funding
- 3. Exploring the Development of Youth "Safe houses"
- Develop Inuit Youth Leadership Training specifically linked with Youth Society Development as an end goal

- 9. Connect Suicide Prevention Initiatives to Kitikmeot communities to provide support for families and communities dealing with the effects of suicide.

- 11. Actively Lobby at all levels to support the search for a solution to the issue of suicide

WHEREAS; THE ELDER'S DELEGATION MET AT A DULY CONSTITUTED ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING IN CAMBRIDGE BAY, NUNAVUT, OCTOBER 4th, 5th & 6th, 2016 TO VOICE THEIR CONCERNS AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO IMPROVE CONDITIONS IN THEIR COMMUNITIES; AND

WHEREAS; THE ELDERS PRESENTED THEIR REPORT TO THE KIA DELEGATION WHICH INCLUDED THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. TO ENSURE ADEQUATE HOME CARE SERVICES IN ALL COMMUNITIES FOR ELDERS AND TO ENSURE THERE IS LONG TERM CARE FACILITIES IN EACH COMMUNITY FOR ELDERS WHO ARE NOT ABLE TO LIVE ON THEIR OWN.
- 2. EXPLORE FUNDING OPPERTUNITIES FOR INFASTRUCTURE, OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE FUNDING FOR ELDERS BUILDINGS IN THE KITIKMEOT
- 3. CONTINUE TO EVOLVE & ENHANCE COMMUNITY BASED PROGRAMS TARGETED AT INCREASING LANGUAGE AND CULTURAL USE AND RETENTION
- 4. THE NEED FOR APPROPRIATE INTERPRETING SERVICES IN SERVICE AREAS SUCH AS AIRPORTS, HEALTH CENTRES, HOME CARE, HAMLETS, STORES SO ELDERS ARE ABLE TO COMMUNICATE IN THEIR LANGUAGE
- 5. EXPLORE OPTIONS FOR SECURING SECRETARIAL & TRESURER SUPPORT FOR ELDERS COMMITTEES.
- 6. THE NEED FOR ACCESSIBLE & FLEXIBLE ELDERS TRANSPORTATION IN ALL KITIKMEOT COMMUNTIES THAT MEETS THE NEEDS OF THE ELDERS PROGRAMMING
- 7. THE NEED TO ADDRESS & HOST DISCUSSIONS FOCUSED ON ELDER VERBAL, PHYSICAL AND FINANCIAL ABUSE THAT EXISTS IN OUR COMMUNTIES WITH FOLLOW UP SUPPORT WITH REGIONAL SERVICE PROVIDERS AND REGIONAL SUPPORT.
- 8. WORK TOWARDS INCREASING BANKING SERVICES ARE AVAILABLE TO ALL KITIKMEOT COMMUNITIES AND LOBBY TO PROTECT ELDERS FINANCING NEEDS
- 9. CONNECT COMMUNITIES OF THE KITIKMEOT WITH NUNAVUT WIDE SUICIDE PREVENTION ACTION PLANNING AND REQUEST THAT COMMUNITY CONSULTATIONS ARE HELD IN PARTNERSHIP WITH KIA TO PLAN SUICIDE PREVENTION ACTIVITIES IN EACH COMMUNITY
- 10. DEVELOP SUPPORTS & DISCUSSIONS FOR ELDERS TO STRENGTHEN HOW THEY CAN PASS ON LANGUAGE IN CULTURAL PROGRAMMING
- 11. EXPLORE POTENTIAL LANGUAGE POLICIES FOR CULTURAL PROGRAMMING TO ENSURE THAT INUKTUN EXPOSURE IS INCREASING LANGUAGE USE
- 12. SUPPORT FOR EXPLORING BLOCK FUNDING OPTIONS FOR LANGUAGE AND CULTURAL PROGRAMS

Whereas; The Issue of Suicide in the Kitikmeot was brought forth as an urgent concern by delegates at a duly constituted KIA Annual General Meeting in Cambridge Bay, Nunavut on October 4, 5 & 6, 2016 and.

Whereas; The KIA Annual General Assembly reviewed and discussed the issue of Suicide which includes the following:

- 1. Connect with Existing programming from the Embrace Life Council and the need to connect directly with Inuit in the Kitikmeot
- 2. Plan in Partnership with existing Nunavut Bodies that have a Suicide Prevention Mandate in connection with the communities of the Kitikmeot
- 3. Ensure that the Nunavut Suicide Prevention Strategies and National Strategies create an action plan in partnership with the communities of the Kitikmeot
- 4. Lobby to ensure that Inuit Specific Suicide Prevention Councilors are included to support Inuit entering the Court Justice System
