And whereas the Government of Nunavut does not yet have a cancer screening and early detection policy,

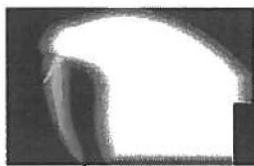
THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT

And whereas the company has approached both the Territorial and Federal Governments for financing support,

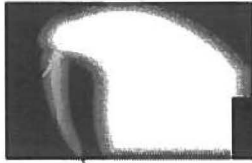

stemming from a dysfunctional administration system,

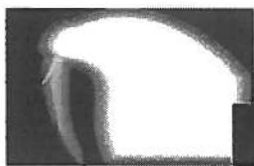
THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT

Cheaper electricity would benefit all businesses in the Kivalliq,

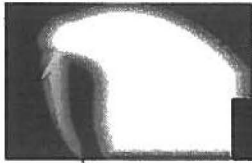
THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT
