2019-10 Municipal Funding

Whereas little progress has been made on important initiatives with Community Government and Services; and

Whereas the cost drivers in operation of municipalities are increasing due to legislation, increased cost of power, and other factors;

Whereas enforcement of ATIPP on the municipalities is legislated, but not to be enforced until hamlets have developed capacity and receive training in this regard;

Therefore, be it resolved that NAM encourage CGS and EIS to take immediate action on this important matter; and

Be it further resolved that NAM encourage CGS to provide funding for the training program to enable municipalities to develop records management systems and convert hard copy information to electronic information to enable municipalities to comply with the ATIIP legislation.
